Cultivating Authentic Relationships	Research has shown that youth, particularly those experiencing challenging circumstances, benefit from positive relationships with adults. Drawing on research from the Search Institute, this eModule covers the essential qualities of developmental relationships and the ways in which Navigators, and other adults working with youth, can cultivate meaningful relationships. This includes strategies for connecting with youth across cultures and backgrounds.	15 minutes	Facilitators Mentors
Positive Youth Development and Communication Skills	This self-directed eLearning Module explores youth development -- the growth process by which all young people seek ways to meet their basic physical and social needs, adolescent brain development, and Positive Youth Development -- an approach to build competencies that are necessary to succeed in adolescence and adulthood.	15 minutes	Facilitators
Facilitation 2.0: Enhancing Your Skills	Whether a new or experienced Navigator, this eModule is designed to help you take your facilitation skills to the next level. As learners continue to experience hybrid learning environments, this eModule highlights strategies and resources for virtual and in-person facilitation. A Trauma Informed Approach to Working with Opportunity Youth	This online course offers an introduction to the concept of trauma-informed care for adults who serve young people impacted by the justice system and foster care systems as well as those from historically underserved communities.
